#### CONSENT TO ADMINISTER MEDICATION

Please note, school staff <u>cannot</u> administer medication to your child (including paracetamol, eye drops, cough syrup etc) unless it has been labelled with your child's name by a pharmacist and the *Consent to Administer Medication* form has been completed. School staff are bound by these regulations and we hope that all parents will acknowledge and cooperate with these rules.

#### **DELAY YOUR PICK-UP**

Did you know that there is no line up at Stop Drop & Go area from around 3.10pm. Students are supervised until 3.20pm, so if you can delay pick up by 10-15 minutes, you will not have to wait in the queue and traffic around the school will be greatly diminished.
